AP APPLICATIONS

Students wishing to enroll in AP courses are required to complete an application for each class during registration in February of the previous school year.

Applications differ by class. Many require a recommendation from the student's current teacher in that subject area. Some AP applications require a writing sample or other evaluation as part of the application process. Students who are approved to enroll in AP courses are likely to have summer reading or homework assignments prior to the start of the course.

WEIGHTED CREDIT

All AP courses are weighted 5.0 on a 4.0 scale
